RESOLUTION NO. 2022-040

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TEXARKANA, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT AN AGREEMENT PROPOSAL FROM VERIZON WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY SERVICES OF IRVING, TEXAS, FOR WIRELESS COMMUNICATION AND SERVICES UTILIZING TEXAS STATE DIR PRICING. IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FOURTY-NINE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$49,800), WITH FUNDS BUDGETED IN DEPARTMENTAL BUDGETS; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City budgets for and requests wireless communication service and equipment for use by the city's personnel; and

WHEREAS, utilizing the State of Texas Co-Op Agreement to purchase these devices and services will allow city personnel to have accessible communication citywide; and

WHEREAS, Verizon Wireless Communications Technology Services of Irving, Texas, is an authorized Texas DIR vendor (Contract DIR-TELE-CTSA-003) for wireless communications; and

WHEREAS, the City has received a proposed Verizon Wireless Communications Technology Services of Irving, Texas, quote from the DIR Contract, Wireless Communications, a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit "A"**; and

WHEREAS, the proposed agreement from Verizon Wireless Communications Technology Services of Irving, Texas, for the Enterprise Agreement is for a proposed term of four (4) years and will be paid in monthly payments of an amount not to exceed \$49,800 per year for a total cost not to exceed \$199,200 in a four-year (4) term; and

WHEREAS, the yearly estimated cost of \$49,800 annually is budgeted in departmental budgets.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TEXARKANA, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: The City Manager be and is hereby authorized to execute an agreement with Verizon Wireless Communications Technology Services of Irving, Texas, for wireless communications, over a four (4) year period, that will be at an amount not to exceed \$49,800 per year for a total cost not to exceed \$199,200.

SECTION 2: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

2 CTSA DOCUMENTS

2.1 Definition

This CTSA includes each of the exhibits and attachments attached to this CTSA, which are hereby incorporated into and deemed part of this CTSA, and unless otherwise expressly stated all references to this CTSA shall include the exhibits and attachments. A listing of the exhibits and attachments is included in the Table of Contents.

2.2 Compliance with Procurement Laws

This CTSA is the result of compliance with applicable procurement laws of the State. DIR issued a solicitation on the CPA's ESBD, RFO DIR-CPO-TMP-552, on January 4, 2021, for TEX-AN 2021 Communications Technology Services. Successful Respondent responded, and DIR conducted its evaluation. DIR determined that Successful Respondent should be invited into negotiations. DIR and Successful Respondent have engaged in extensive negotiations, discussions, and due diligence that have culminated in the formation of the contractual relationship described in this CTSA. Upon execution of all CTSA's arising from the RFO, a notice of award for RFO DIR-CPO-TMP-552 shall be posted by DIR on the ESBD.

2.3 Order of Precedence

In the event of any conflict or contradiction between or among the various documents comprising the CTSA, the documents will control in the following order of precedence:

- a) Articles 1 through 22 of this CTSA, and all amendments thereto,
- b) Exhibit A Definitions to the CTSA, and all amendments thereto,
- c) All other Exhibits to the CTSA, and all amendments thereto,
- d) Attachments to the CTSA, and all amendments thereto,
- e) Appendices to the CTSA, and all amendments thereto;
- f) Successful Respondent's final Response dated March 29, 2021, and incorporated by reference herein.
- g) The RFO Number DIR-CPO-TMP-552, as amended and clarified by DIR official revisions or addenda, and incorporated by reference herein.

3 TERM

3.1 Initial Term

The Initial Term of this CTSA shall commence on the Effective Date, date of last signature, and continue for four (4) years from the Effective Date, unless this CTSA is terminated earlier as provided herein, in

which case the Initial Term of this CTSA shall end at 11:59:59 p.m., Central Time, on the effective date of such termination (the "Initial Term").

3.2 Extension(s)

Executive Summary and Background Information:

A review of the 2020 census data revealed that a population imbalance exists in three of the wards within Texarkana, TX. The City has retained redistricting services with Bickerstaff Heath Delgado Acosta LLP to assist with the redistricting process.

The 2020 census data review has shown a growth in population in Ward 5, and a decrease in population in Wards 1 and 2. This will require redistricting of the wards in Texarkana, TX to provide approximate equal representation within each ward. Following a recent council workshop, drafts of these ward changes were developed and are represented in the proposed plan document located on the city's website at <http://ci.texarkana.tx.us/808/City-of-Texarkana-TX-Ward-Redistricting>. Hard copies of the proposed plan were also made available at City Hall, 220 Texas Blvd, Texarkana, Texas 75501.

The City Council has sought citizen input in the redistricting process. A public comment period began Monday, April 4th, 2022 and continued until Monday, April 18th, 2022 at 5pm. The City also held a public hearing on Monday, April 11th, 2022 during its regularly scheduled meeting regarding the proposed redistricting plan.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-035

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TEXARKANA, TEXAS, APPROVING THE REDISTRICTING OF THE CITY'S SINGLE-MEMBER COUNCIL WARDS AND ESTABLISHING NEW WARD BOUNDARY LINES FOR TEXARKANA CITY COUNCIL ELECTIONS BASED ON 2020 CENSUS DATA; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the results of the 2020 federal Census have been considered and indicate that the City of Texarkana's single-member council wards are sufficiently out of population balance to require redistricting in order to comply with the "one-person, one-vote" (equal population) principle established by the U.S. Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the City of Texarkana, Texas (the "City") engaged the law firm of Bickerstaff Heath Delgado Acosta LLP to act as the City's redistricting consultant, including advising and assisting the City Council in preparation of a new redistricting plan in compliance with applicable requirements of state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, on February 28, 2022, by Resolution No. 2022-013, the City Council adopted redistricting criteria to assist the City and the public in developing redistricting plans which comply with applicable federal and state laws, and the adopted redistricting criteria were applied in the development of the City's new redistricting plan; and

WHEREAS, on February 28, 2022, by Resolution No. 2022-012, the City Council also adopted redistricting guidelines regarding the submission of written comments and proposed plans by the public, to ensure the ability of the City to timely receive and adequately consider them; and

WHEREAS, during the redistricting process the City provided (i) notice to the public of the City Council's proposed discussions and development of a redistricting plan through meeting agendas posted in compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act and notices on the City's website regarding public hearings, (ii) an opportunity for public comment at a special public hearing held on April 11, 2022, and (iii) an opportunity for submission of written public comments during a comment period which opened with the passage and approval of Resolution No. 2022-012 and closed at 5 p.m., April 18, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered (i) various proposed plans regarding the appropriate reconfiguration of the council member city wards and the attached proposed redistricting plan at City Council workshops and meetings held on March 28, April 11, and April 25, 2022, (ii) reports from the City's redistricting consultant, and (iii) oral testimony and written comments, if submitted; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the attached city council ward redistricting plan is in the best interest of the citizens of the City, complies with the adopted redistricting criteria, and is believed to comply with all state and federal requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TEXARKANA, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That the existing single-member city ward boundary lines for the City of Texarkana are hereby amended, and the new districting plan depicted on the map attached hereto as **Exhibit ‘A’**, defining new wards, as such new wards are further described in the tables attached hereto as **Exhibit ‘B’** reporting populations and demographic statistics for each such new ward, is hereby adopted and designated to define the City’s SIX single-member council wards from and after the Effective Date; that **Exhibits ‘A’** and **‘B’** are incorporated by reference in and made a part of this ORDINANCE, and shall be kept on file in the City Secretary’s Office.

SECTION 2: That this ORDINANCE shall take and be given effect immediately; and that hereafter all Texarkana City Council elections shall be held under and in accordance with the new single-member council ward districting plan here adopted by the City Council until such time as a subsequent lawfully-enacted districting plan shall be adopted to replace this plan.

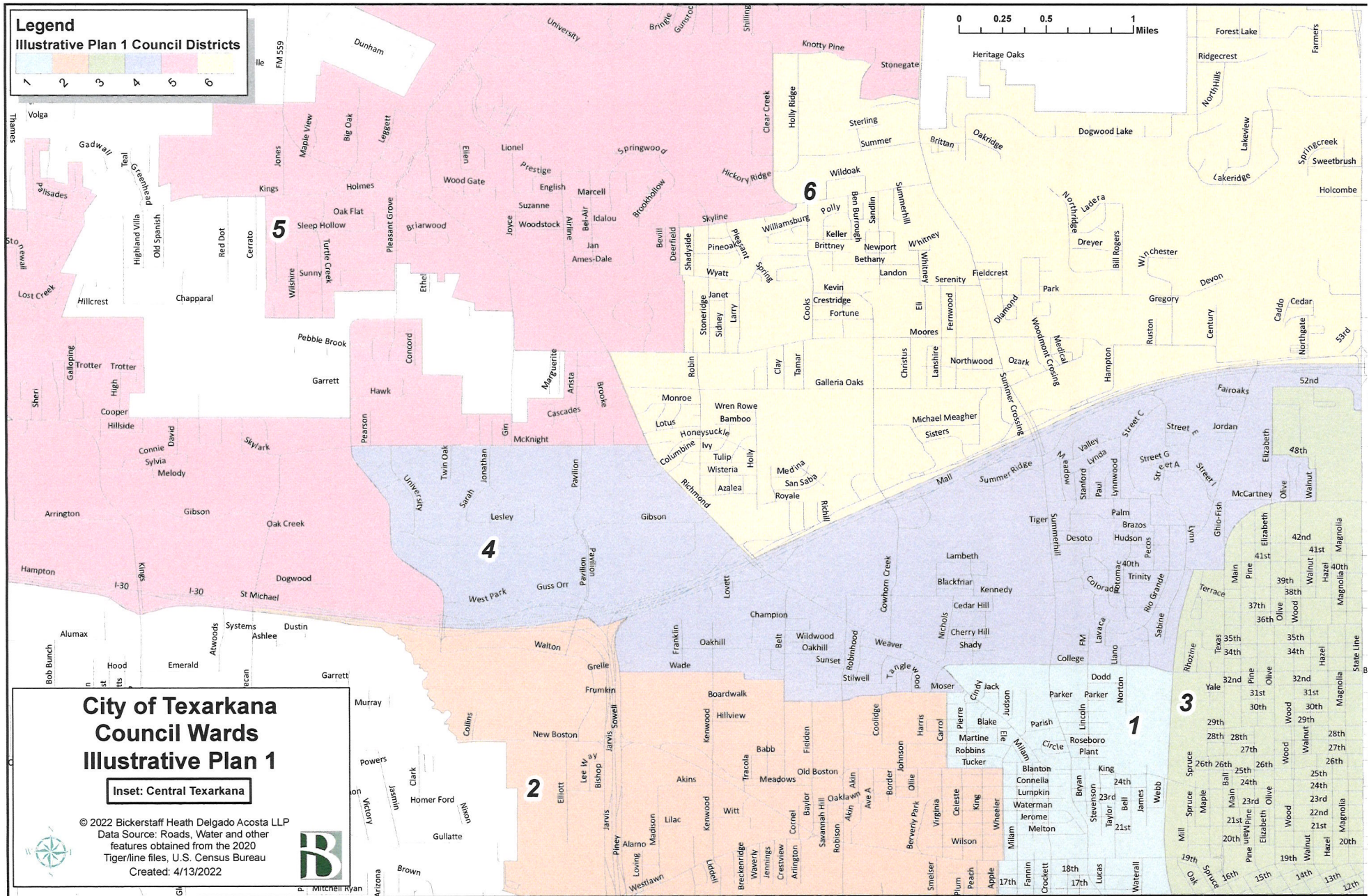

Executive Summary and Background Information:

This is a request by Curtis Murray, owner, for a Specific Use Permit to allow the location of a double wide HUD code manufactured home as a residence on Lots 1, and 2, Block 2, Grandview Addition, located the southwest corner of Findley Street and McBride Street. The property is currently zoned Single Family-3 and is vacant land.

The adjacent zoning is Single Family-2 to the east and north, and Single Family-3 to the west and south. The adjacent land use is a residence to the west, and vacant land to the east, west, and south.

The Future Land Use Map shows a designation of "Neighborhood Residential".

The City's Zoning Ordinance was amended to comply with the state law in 2002, requiring that all manufactured housing be HUD code building standard. This amendment also stipulated that all HUD code manufactured homes inside the city limits be placed in the Single Family-3 zoning district along with the approval of a Specific Use Permit.

Staff recommends for approval of this request with the following stipulations:

1. That one new 2020 or newer single wide HUD code manufactured home be allowed on this property.
2. That the single wide HUD code manufactured home be tied down/skirted/underpinned.

3. That the single wide HUD code manufactured home be used for dwelling purposes only, human occupancy only.
4. That the Specific Use Permit be in effect for a period of three (3) years, beginning at the date of this Ordinance. It is the owner's responsibility to renew this permit.
5. That if the HUD code manufactured home is not placed on the property within the three (3) year period, the Specific Use Permit will automatically be revoked.
6. The metal fencing on the property must be removed.
7. That all driveways, parking, building codes/setbacks, engineered foundation, platting and flood plain requirements must be in accordance with the City of Texarkana, Texas codes.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TEXARKANA, TEXAS, AMENDING THE ZONING MAP SHOWING THE LOCATION, BOUNDARY, AND USE OF CERTAIN PROPERTY BY THE GRANTING OF SPECIFIC USE PERMIT NO. S-750 TO ALLOW THE LOCATION OF A HUD CODE MANUFACTURED HOME ON LOTS 1, AND 2, BLOCK 2, GRANDVIEW ADDITION, LOCATED AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF FINDLEY STREET AND MCBRIDE STREET, IN THE CITY OF TEXARKANA, BOWIE COUNTY, TEXAS; CONTAINING A REPEALER CLAUSE; CONTAINING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, an application has been filed with the City of Texarkana, Texas, requesting an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance to grant a **Specific Use Permit** to allow the location of a HUD code manufactured home on **Lots 1, and 2, Block 2, in the Grandview Addition, located at the southwest corner of Findley Street and McBride Street**, in the City of Texarkana, Bowie County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Texarkana, Texas, and the City Council of the City of Texarkana, Texas, in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas with reference to the granting of zoning classifications and changes, have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have afforded and held full and fair hearings to all property owners generally and to all persons interested and situated in the affected area and in the vicinity thereof; and

WHEREAS, after consideration of said application, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Texarkana, Texas, voted **unanimously five (5) to zero (0) to recommend** to the City Council of Texarkana, Texas, that a **Specific Use Permit be granted to allow the location of a HUD code manufactured home with stipulations** on said property; and

WHEREAS, after consideration of said application and the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission, the City Council of the City of Texarkana, Texas, does hereby find that granting the **Specific Use Permit** is in the best interest of the public health, safety, morals and general welfare of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TEXARKANA, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Texarkana, Texas, Ordinance No. 127-70, passed and approved on September 14, 1970, be further amended to grant **Specific Use Permit Numbered S-750 for the location of a HUD code manufactured home** on Lots 1, and 2, Block 2, in the Grandview Addition, located at the southwest corner of Findley Street and McBride Street, in the City of Texarkana, Bowie County, Texas.

SECTION 2: That the following stipulations are hereby imposed and made a part of this ordinance:

1. That a 2022 or newer single-wide HUD code manufactured home be allowed on this property. See attached floor plan of home.
2. That the single-wide HUD code manufactured home be tied down/skirted/underpinned.
3. That the single-wide HUD code manufactured home be used for dwelling purposes only, human occupancy only.
4. That the Specific Use Permit be in effect for a period of three (3) years, beginning at the date of this ordinance. It is the owner's responsibility to renew this permit.
5. That if the HUD code manufactured home is not placed on the property within the three (3) year period, the Specific Use Permit will automatically be revoked.
6. Must remove metal fencing on the property.
7. That all driveways, parking, building codes/setbacks, engineered foundation, platting and flood plain requirements must be in accordance with the City of Texarkana, Texas codes.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are specifically repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 4: It is further provided that in case a section, clause, sentence or part of this ordinance shall be deemed or adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, then such invalidity shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance.

SECTION 5: That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

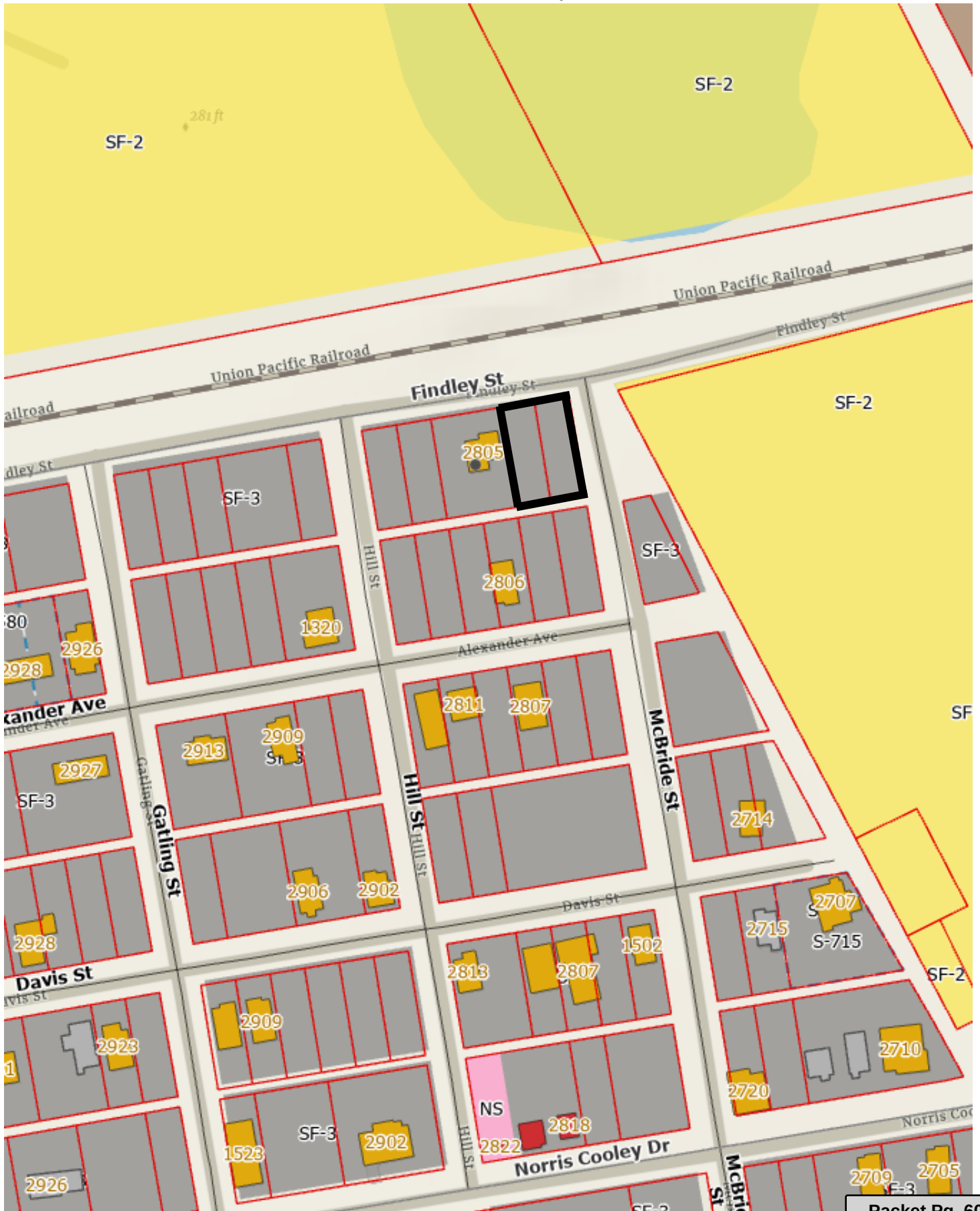

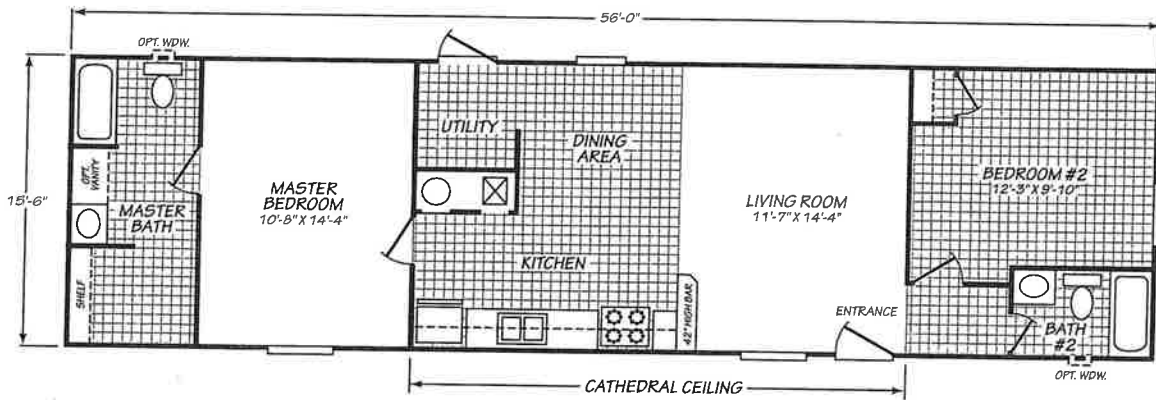

Executive Summary and Background Information:

This is a request by Christine Boulton, owner for a Specific Use Permit to allow a daycare/preschool on an approximate 2.58-acre tract of land (being Tract 3) in the Chancellor Beach HRS, A-731 (Exhibit 'A'), located at 3700 North Robison Road. The property is zoned Multiple Family-1 and is currently a church.

Executive Summary and Background Information:

This is a request for site plan approval by Kirk Patton, PHRMG Developers, owner, and Marcus Foran, agent, requesting a site plan approval on a 1.501-acre tract of land, Lot 1, Block1, Richmond-Moores Subdivision, located at 5605 Richmond Road. This property is vacant land.

The adjacent zoning is Planned Development General Retail to the north, south, and west, and General Retail to the east. The adjacent land use is carwash to the north, a restaurant and multi-tenant general retail to the south and east, and vacant land to the west.

The Future Land Use Map designates this property as "Neighborhood Retail".

The site plan consists of the following:

1. The construction of a 6,092 sq. ft. building.
2. The façade will be stone and brick.
3. The access driveway will be off Richmond Road and Moores Lane. Any driveway improvements on Richmond will need TXDOT approval.
4. 84 parking spaces and 4 handicapped spaces. Each parking space must be a minimum of 180 sq. ft. (9'x20' or 10'x18').
5. A 35' pole sign. No Electronic messaging will be allowed. Wall signs as indicated on the elevations.
6. Screened dumpster located in the northwest corner of the parking lot.
7. Drive thru located at the south side of building.

Fire Department comments as follows:

8. If the most remote part of the building is more than 150 feet away “travel distance” from the centerline of a public road the property must have a fire lane and adequate turning radius for 40’ WB.
9. If the most remote part of the building is more than 400 feet away “travel distance” from a fire hydrant a new hydrant will have to be added.
10. If the building is being sprinkled the FDC must be no more than 100 feet away “travel distance” from the nearest fire hydrant.

Texarkana Water Utilities Comments as follows:

1. There is an existing 6” water main on the west side of Richmond Road and on the south side of Moores Lane.
2. There is an existing 8” sanitary sewer main on the north side of Moores Lane and on the west side of Richmond Road. The exact locations will need to be field verified.
3. A grease trap with sample port will be required for the kitchen, and verification that only grease-bearing wastewater is going to the grease trap.
4. HVAC condensate shall not discharge to sanitary sewer.
5. An RPPA shall be installed on domestic water meter.
6. An RPPA shall be installed on lawn irrigation system if installed. Lawn irrigation system shall have a separate tap and meter. Irrigation system shall be a 1-inch meter as a minimum.
7. A review of internal plumbing plans for potential cross connection and backflow issues is required.

The applicant should also be aware that if this site plan approval item is approved, all other applicable city code/ordinance requirements must be met including but not limited to building codes, setbacks, subdivision, fire, parking, drainage, water and sewer prior to the issuance of building permits.

WHEREAS, after consideration of said application, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Texarkana, Texas, voted **unanimously by a vote of five (5) to zero (0) to recommend approval of the petition for a site plan (Exhibit ‘A’)** to the City Council of the City of Texarkana, Texas; and

WHEREAS, after consideration of said application and the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission, the City Council of the City of Texarkana, Texas, does hereby find that the approval of the site plan for the above described property is in the best interest of the public health, safety, morals and general welfare of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TEXARKANA, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That the site plan **(Exhibit ‘A’)** on **Lot 1, Block 1, Richmond Moores Subdivision, located at 5605 Richmond Road** in the City of Texarkana, Texas, Bowie County, Texas, is hereby approved and hereby amends PD-20-6(GR).

SECTION 2: PD-20-6(GR) is hereby amended by approval of the site plan (**Exhibit ‘A’**), incorporated herein by reference for all purposes, and includes the following:

Phase I:

1. The construction of a 6,092 sq. ft. building.
2. The façade will be stone and brick.
3. The access driveway will be off Richmond Road and Moores Lane. Any driveway improvements on Richmond will need TxDOT approval.
4. Eighty-four (84) parking spaces and four (4) handicapped spaces. Each parking space must be a minimum of 180 sq. ft. (9’x20’ or 10’x18’).
5. A 35’ pole sign. No Electronic messaging will be allowed. Wall signs as indicated on the elevations.
6. Screened dumpster located in the northwest corner of the parking lot.
7. Drive thru located at the south side of building.

Fire Department comments as follows:

8. If the most remote part of the building is more than 150 feet away “travel distance” from the centerline of a public road the property must have a fire lane and adequate turning radius for 40’ WB.
9. If the most remote part of the building is more than 400 feet away “travel distance” from a fire hydrant a new hydrant will have to be added.
10. If the building is being sprinkled the FDC must be no more than 100 feet away “travel distance” from the nearest fire hydrant.

Texarkana Water Utilities comments as follows:

1. There is an existing 6” water main on the west side of Richmond Road and on the south side of Moores Lane.
2. There is an existing 8” sanitary sewer main on the north side of Moores Lane and on the west side of Richmond Road. The exact locations will need to be field verified.
3. A grease trap with sample port will be required for the kitchen, and verification that only grease-bearing wastewater is going to the grease trap.
4. HVAC condensate shall not discharge to sanitary sewer.
5. An RPPA shall be installed on domestic water meter.
6. An RPPA shall be installed on lawn irrigation system if installed. Lawn irrigation system shall have a separate tap and meter. Irrigation system shall be a 1-inch meter as a minimum.
7. A review of internal plumbing plans for potential cross connection and backflow issues is required.

SECTION 3: It is further provided that in case a section, clause, sentence or part of this ordinance shall be deemed or adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, then such invalidity shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance.

SECTION 4: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are specifically repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 5: That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

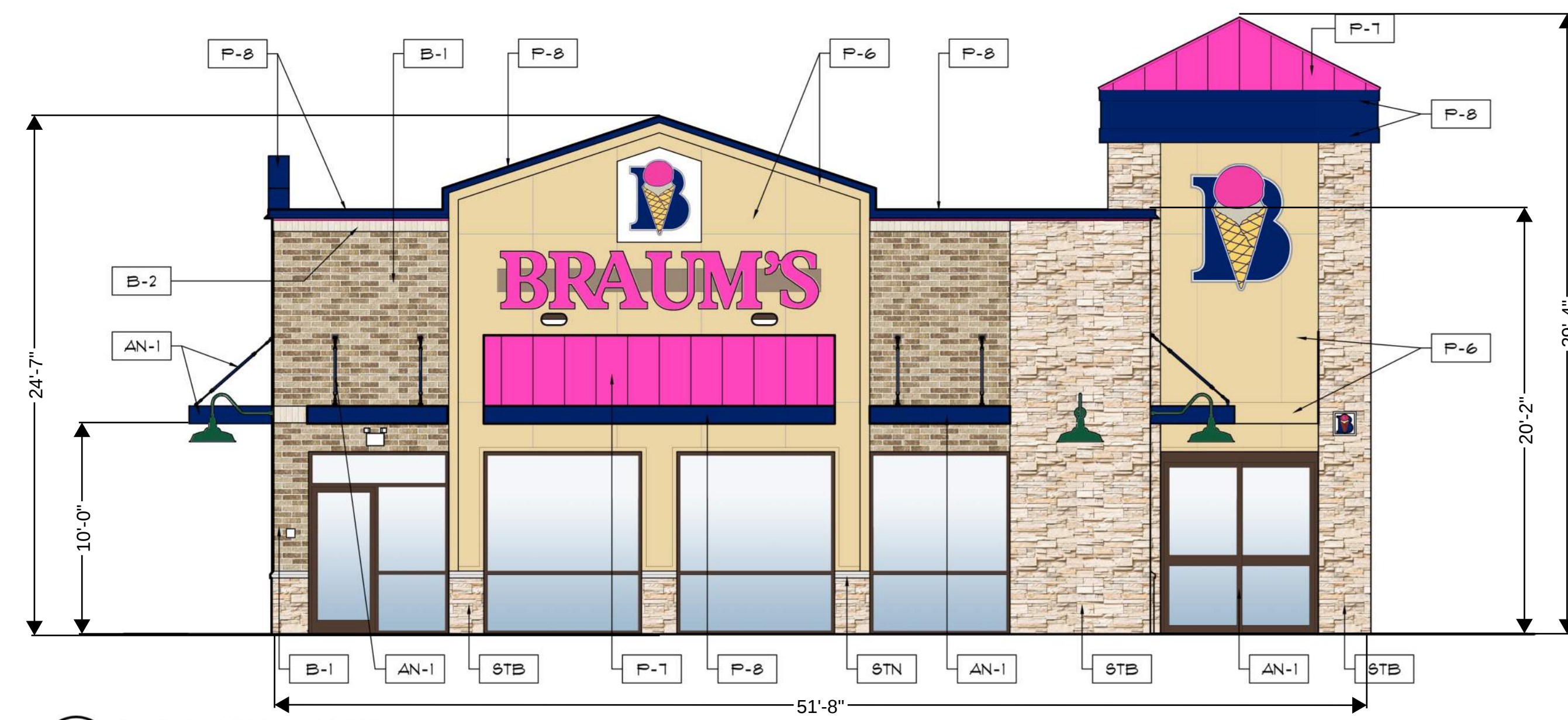

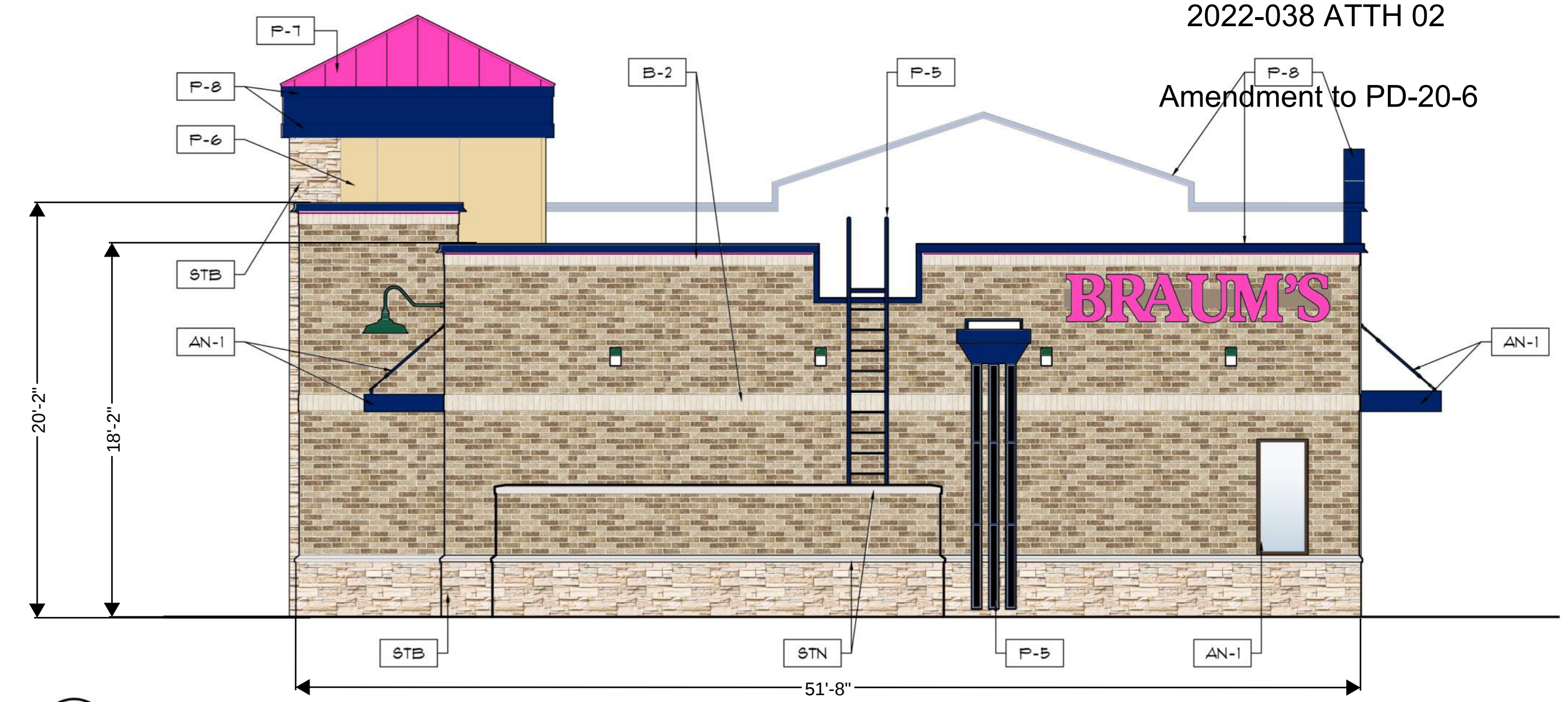

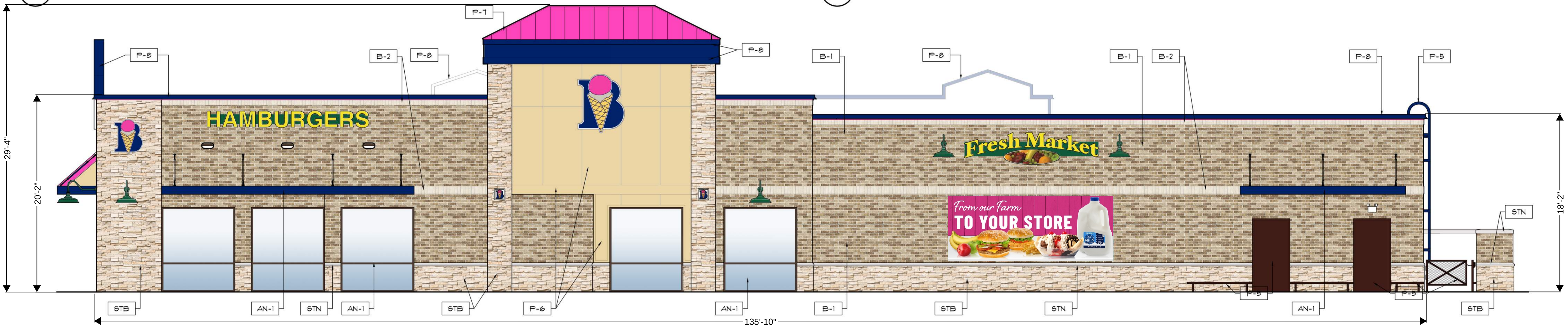
EAST ELEVATION

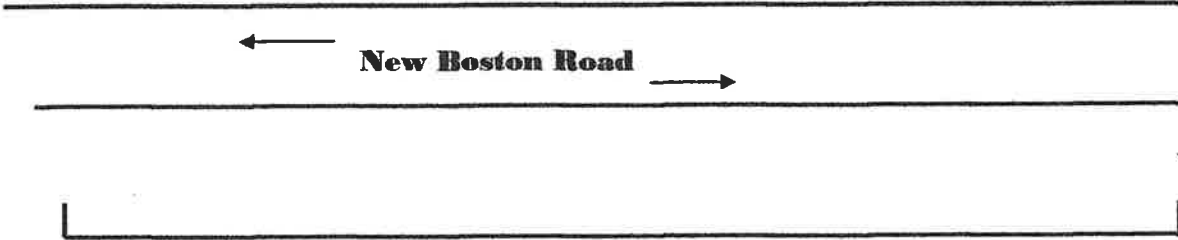

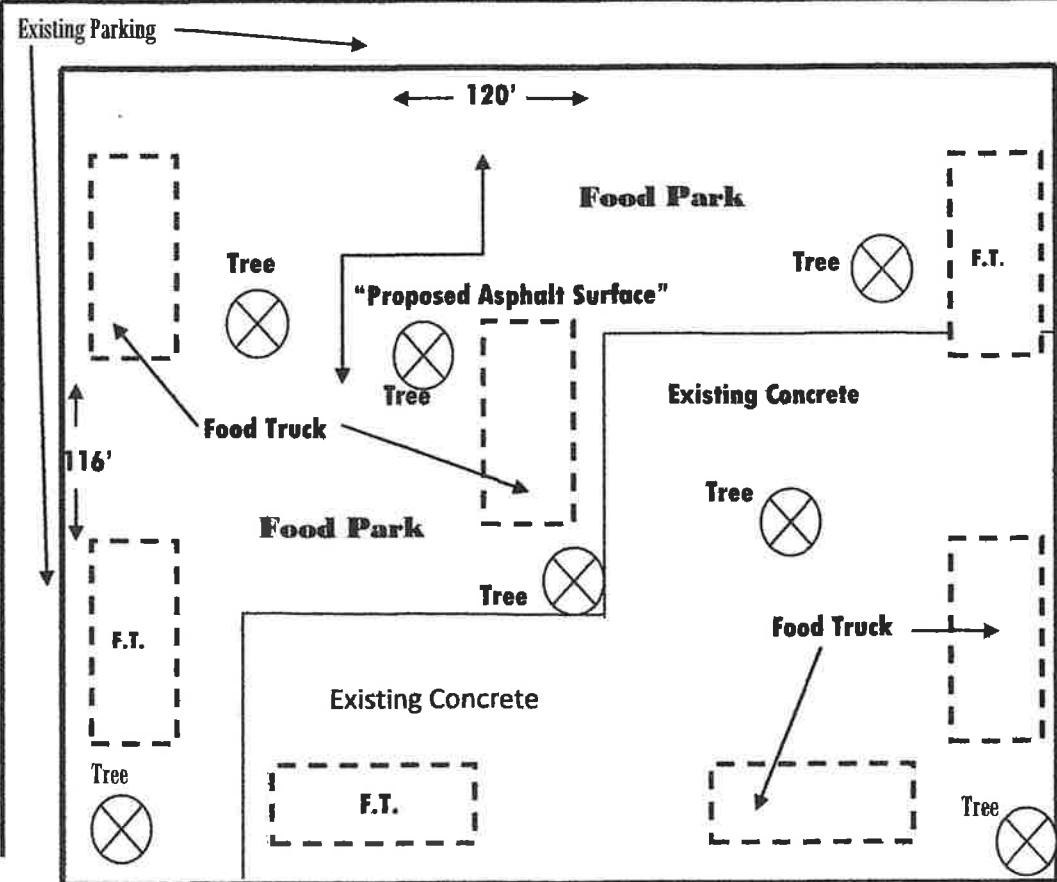
